State Banquet Red Wine

In 1956, Premier Zhou Enlai personally approved the allocation of 650000 yuan to Changyu Company as a special fund to improve the quality of famous liquor, laying the foundation for the qualitative leap of Changyu liquor. As early as the 1930s and 1940s, Changyu fine wine was hailed as the "national soul wine" by the Chinese people in Nanyang. Nowadays, it has become a banquet wine for major national events.

In September 1949, during the first plenary session of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, Changyu Fine Wine was used as a state banquet wine; In 1955, the People's Liberation Army of China awarded Chang Yu fine wine as a celebratory banquet wine; In 1962, during the Third National Political Consultative Conference, Changyu Fine Wine was used as a banquet wine; In November 2009, during the visit of US President Obama to China, at a banquet at the first stop of the Diaoyutai State Guesthouse in Shanghai and Beijing, Changyu Centennial Cellar Dry Red Wine and Changyu Eiffeburg Winery were used as banquet wines; In December of the same year, during the visit of French Prime Minister Fillon to China, at a banquet at the Great Hall of the People, Changyu Eiffeburg Master level Cabernet Sauvignon dry red, Chardonnay dry white, and Changyu Golden Ice Valley ice wine were used as banquet wines; On September 27 of the same year, at the Great Hall of the People, state leaders held a banquet to welcome visiting Russian President Dmitry Medvedev. The wines served at the banquet were Changyu Centennial Cellar Dry Red and Changyu Eiffeburg Winery Chardonnay Dry White; In 2011, Brazilian President Dilma Rousseff visited China, and in February 2012, German Chancellor Merkel visited China, both using wines such as the Changyu Centennial Cellar. The G20 Leaders Summit held in Hangzhou in 2016 also selected Changyu dry red and dry white wines
