Barov Balboa Chateau, Changyu, Xinjiang

——"Wine Lovers" at the Foot of Tianshan Mountains

"The wine here is like a passionate lover!"!, Standing on the west bank of the Manas River at the foot of the Tianshan Mountains in Xinjiang, Count John Salvi, a world wine master in his seventies, humorously compares it. This old man regards wine as his lover and is the honorary winemaker and chief winemaker of Barov Balboa Chateau in Changyu, Xinjiang. After traveling to over 40 countries, he successfully found the Xinjiang Barov Balboa Chateau wine, which is like a "passionate lover".

Changyu Barov Balboa Chateau is located in Nanshan New District, Shihezi City, Xinjiang, known as the "Pearl of the Gobi Desert", covering an area of 1000 acres. Through the huge estate gate resembling a Arc de Triomphe, one can see a 19th-century French classical style main castle, with red and white walls paired with a blue and black roof, romantic and beautiful, and several similar style small castles around. In front of the main castle is a carefully designed large flower bed, with long grape corridors distributed on each side. The manor garden blends French classics with Chinese Western Regions culture. Against the particularly clear blue sky and white clouds of Xinjiang, this estate is particularly spectacular.

Arriving at Barov Balboa Chateau in Changyu, Xinjiang, an underground wine cellar is a must visit. In the 6000 square meter semi-circular wine cellar, over 2000 oak barrels are neatly arranged, emitting a faint aroma of wine.

There is also a wine filling line, wine display and tasting area, VIP wine tasting room, 4D cinema, circular cinema, catering and conference center, and wine culture exhibition hall in the main castle building of the winery. Visitors can learn about the wine production process at this winery and experience wine tasting under the guidance of wine tasters. Standing at the height of the winery castle, overlooking the "Green Sea" of grapes at the foot of the Tianshan Mountains, the air seems to be filled with the fragrance of grapes.

Most people who have come to Xinjiang will fall in love with the grapes here. The grapes in Turpan are particularly sweet, while the Kazakh girls from Xinjiang, who are good at running horses and catching lambs, have a "manly" temperament. The average annual sunshine time in Xinjiang reaches 2800 hours, so the glucose content in brewing here is as high as 23 degrees. The Changyu Barov Balboa Chateau wine made from such grapes is as passionate and unrestrained as a girl from Xinjiang, with an alcohol content 1 and a half degrees higher than dry red wine from other regions. It is a highly personalized dry red wine.

Changyu Barov Balboa Chateau has a deep ruby red color, with a rich aroma of black berries and elegant oak. It has a rich and plump taste, round and full, with rich layering, strong structure, and a long aftertaste.

No wonder Count Salvi said that tasting the wine here is like being in the arms of a passionate lover, bringing a burning feeling of passion. Saarland recommends that if family, friends, and partners drink this wine, it is easy to bring each other's hearts closer together.

Food experts also believe that full-bodied wines are very suitable for the dietary habits of Chinese people. Whether it's Sichuan and Hunan cuisine, Jiangsu and Zhejiang cuisine, meat or seafood, fruit flavored wines can be paired with them, bringing a different and wonderful taste experience.

Xinjiang is a fascinating tourist destination. If you have the opportunity to visit Xinjiang, don't miss the Changyu Babao Baron Manor, which is only a 2-hour drive from Urumqi.
